Activities

This past November, we teamed up with Cub Foods, the Henderson Foundation and the Henderson brothers (E.J. & Erin) of the Minnesota Vikings to distribute over 2000 turkeys to families in need.

In December, MAAPFA along with Mayor R.T. Rybak and others donated toys to the parents in Community Action/Head Start Kids Wish Tree Christmas gift drive.

In January, we teamed up with the Minnesota

Council for Black Minnesotans and the Network for the Development of Children of African Descent (NdCAD) to read to children and distribute free books during the annual Dr.

Martin Luther King Jr. holiday and celebration.

In February, we teamed up with the Science Museum of Minnesota for their *Melanie Rucker Turkey African Americans is Giveaway at Cub Foods Vice President/Captain Science Day* to demonstrate safety equipment and emphasize that a scientific process went into developing firefighter safety equipment.

In partnership with the MFD, we have distributed and installed over 1000 smoke and carbon monoxide detectors to Minneapolis residents.

We are proud supporters and contributors to the **2011 Miss Black Minnesota USA Scholarship Pageant**.

MAAPFA in partnership with The Burn Center at Regions Hospital in St. Paul helped send children burn victims to Cheley Children's Hospital Burn Camp in Colorado which helps kids of all ages deal with burn injuries.

We also work with the Minnesota Partnership for Action Against Tobacco (MPAAT) to help

reduce and eliminate smoking within our community. We have operated booths at the State Fair, Juneteenth and the Urban League's Family Day to encourage and assist community members to stop smoking.

Last, but not least, MAAPEA has an on-going commitment to our youth from school involvement with our fire safety programs, fire service awareness and recruitment presentations, to stay-in school and graduate presentations. As a result of our great work, the International Association of Black Professional Firefighters' awarded MAAPEA with the 2008 Community Service Award.
